All that changed on December 5, 2014. While hanging Christmas lights at her home she received a phone call from a reporter with the *Sublette Examiner*. The reporter asked her if she was excited to be able to begin to perform same sex marriages. Telling him her Christian belief that “marriage was the union of one man and one woman” and that that belief precluded her from performing such weddings set off a chain of events that would ultimately see the Wyoming Commission on Judicial Conduct and Ethics recommending to the state Supreme Court that she be removed both from her position as municipal judge and Circuit court magistrate.

This drastic action was recommended even though she never was asked to perform a same sex marriage nor had ever refused to do one. Judge Neely’s beliefs were enough to get her into trouble, even though our constitution guarantees us the right of free speech and freedom to practice our faith. Currently, Judge Neely’s case is pending an appeal at the Wyoming State Supreme court. Please pray that justice prevails and that Character still counts in Wyoming.
